



The 2009 GE/NMF Medical Scholars Program

Established in 2005, the GE Medical Scholars Program is an international fellowship offered annually to eligible 4th year minority medical students. GE/NMF Medical Scholars complete a two-month elective in Ghana, West Africa, focused on critical regional health care needs. The Class of 2009 is comprised of twelve outstanding 4th year medical students from 12 states and 11 medical schools. There were many qualified applicants this year, and the International Advisory Board chose the Class of 2009 based on the strength of their medical school recommendations, personal statements, academic achievements, and interviews.
